This year's celebrations in Derby are being coordinated by Derby City Of Sanctuary, a network of organisations uniting to make our city a welcoming place for those seeking sanctuary.

Derby holds a marvellous history of offering sanctuary to people fleeing war and persecution, offering compassion to refugees who need protection. Those who receive sanctuary not only enrich our communities but also bring vital skills to our city including for our schools, hospitals and businesses, whilst they rebuild their lives.




