- Helping to prepare classes and deliver these alongside our long-term volunteer

What are we looking for?

We are looking for someone who has a good sound knowledge of British culture, with a particular interest in media such as radio, theatre, cinema and TV.

This volunteer role may suit a retired professional who has a background in teaching/training, although this is not essential. We are looking for a sociable, outgoing individual who enjoys working with people in a supportive learning environment.
