Llangors Church in Wales and Cradoc Primary schools were recognised as Schools of Sanctuary this year and 4 others are actively working towards this. We've been able to give books about sanctuary issues to 6 schools

- . arranged 4 exhibitions of work on the Theme of Sanctuary.
- . assisted Hay Castle with an exhibition about Welsh contemporary refugee art
- . spoke at Royal Welsh show about Schools of Sanctuary at a celebration of Powys County Council deciding to try to become a county of Sanctuary
- . Worked with Beacons for Ukraine on a audio record about Ukrainian resettlement.
- . Highlighted petitions and causes advocating for a fairer and more just Asylum system by mailings and social media and via stalls at local fetes and shows. .
