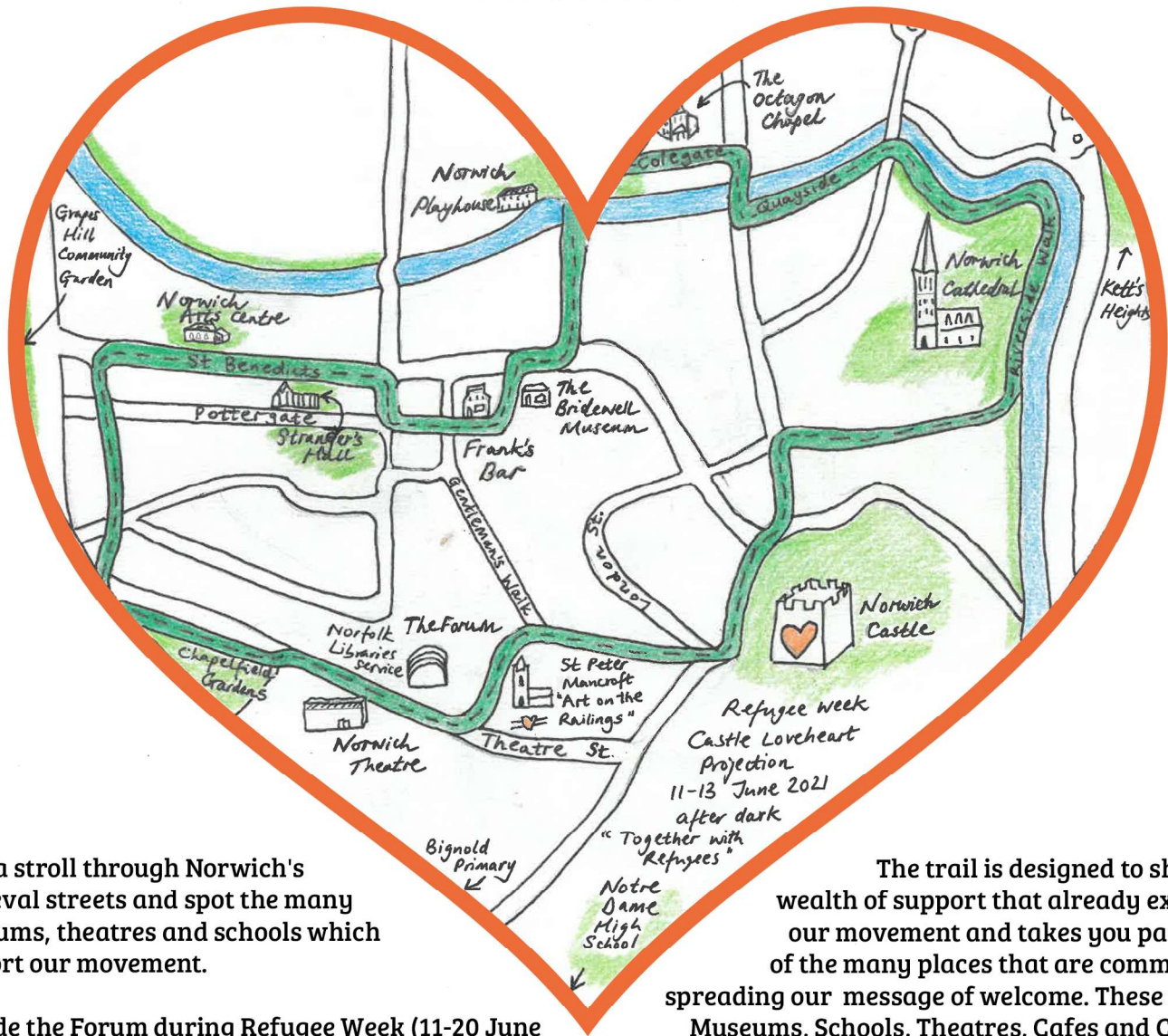




Norwich City of Sanctuary TRAIL



Take a stroll through Norwich's medieval streets and spot the many museums, theatres and schools which support our movement.

Outside the Forum during Refugee Week (11-20 June 2021) you'll see our 'Art on the Railings' exhibition on the theme of "Together with Refugees." Local creatives and school children have contributed pieces of poster art inspired by words such as Refuge, Hope, Migration and Displacement.

Walk past Norwich Castle after dark on 11-13 June (inclusive) and you'll see a giant orange love heart promoting the hashtag #TogetherWithRefugees. The artwork is made up of the faces of Norwich people who sent in their photo in support of the simple pledge: We want Norwich to be a welcoming city. Clive Lewis, MP for Norwich South, is included among the faces which make up the design.

The trail is designed to show the wealth of support that already exists for our movement and takes you past some of the many places that are committed to spreading our message of welcome. These include Museums, Schools, Theatres, Cafes and Chapels.

Outside the city centre, there are over 120 schools that took part in Norfolk Schools of Sanctuary's 'Day of Welcome', which helps pupils to explore and better understand issues of migration and why people become refugees.

The trail also aims to show Norwich's many green spaces and coincides with the launch of our 'Green Map of Norwich'. This map, designed with newcomers to the city in mind, details the many public green spaces in Norwich, such as Chapelfield Gardens. It also shows the community gardens and allotments which form a part of our Gardens of Sanctuary stream.
